Willie has since been released from prison and is attending a fundamental black congregation.

While spending eight months in prison Guillermo lost his business, his home, and his wife. He says, I'm not too sad, I gained Christ. He is now living with his married son in Atlanta trying to start a new life.

Heraldo has been out of prison for several months, he attended the mission for awhile, then began to miss more and more. He has now returned to drugs, and whenever I see him he is completely incoherent because of drugs effects. Please pray for Herald.

Migrant Ministry Report: This is the best peach crop seen in these parts for many years. The bad side is it demands many more hours of labor for the workers, and allows them less time to attend our Thursday night services. One blessing is Santiago. He is a young man with a wife and baby back in Mexico.
